## Rules of the Competition

The Bloomsburg Fair Queen Program observes and complies with all rules and regulations set forth by the PA State Fair Queen Program

Each contestant must:

1. Be a female who is a U.S. Citizen and a resident of Pennsylvania.
2. Be a current student or graduate of one of the following school districts: Bloomsburg, Berwick, Benton, Central Columbia, Danville, Southern Columbia, Columbia Montour Vo-Tech, Millville.
3. Be at least age 16, but not older than 20, years of age as of June 1 of the year entering the local contest.
4. Have not been a former local Fair Queen winner, nor a former PA Fair Queen Contestant.
5. Not hold any other State title for any other commodity group or pageant during her reign.
6. Have her parent's/guardian's consent if under 18 yearsold.
7. Be single, have never been married, have not been pregnant nor given birth to a child.
8. Complete and submit the application and 300 word essay June 1, 2026.
9. Participate in each phase of the judged competition.
10. Act in accordance with the PA Fair Queen Behavior Policy and Dress Code (see attached).
11. Contestants may not be the immediate family of the Bloomsburg Fair Board of Directors or the sponsor.

The Bloomsburg Fair Queen crowning ceremony will be held on Saturday, June 20, 2026 at the Bloomsburg Fair Industrial Arts Building.

At the pageant competition, each contestant will be:

1. Judged on poise, appearance, neatness, ability to communicate, and knowledge of the fair industry.
2. Be interviewed by the judges for approximately 10-15 minutes.
3. Submit a written essay of 300 words or less. The theme of the essay will be "What the Bloomsburg Fair means to my Community."
4. Present a 3-5-minute speech on "Why you should come to my fair."
5. Answer an impromptu question.

#### Awards Given:

1. The Queen's reign will begin when she is crowned at the Bloomsburg Fair Queen Competition and will run until her successor is crowned.
2. The winner will receive a \$1000.00 cash award. The runner up will receive a \$500.00 cash award.
3. The newly crowned Queen is expected to be visible during the fair and make appearances and present awards as requested throughout the fair and her reign.
4. It is expected that the winner will compete in the State Queen contest during the Pennsylvania State Association of County Fairs convention held in Hershey, PA in January 2027. The registration fee (including appropriate banquets) and lodging will be provided for the Queen.

#### **FAIR QUEEN BEHAVIOR POLICY:**

The Contest's governing Board shall have the sole discretion to determine whether, in its judgement, the Queen, Alternate or Contestants may continue to participate in the Program, in the event that the Board determines that any statement or representation is not true and accurate, or that any action is inconsistent with the rules, standards and dignity of the Program.

The following will be considered violations of the Policy and will be grounds for immediate disqualification, dismissal and/or being banned from future Queen competitions:

1. Any infractions of any Queen Contest rules.
2. Smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, chewing gum, foul language and/or public displays of affection to dates/boyfriends while wearing crown and/or sash and representing the Queen Program.
3. Engagement in any illegal, unpartisan, unethical, indecent and/or morally questionable behavior, including but not limited to online representations on the Internet such as social networking sites (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Tik Tok, etc.).
4. Use of any illegal controlled dangerous substances or abusing the use of alcohol or other dangerous substances.
5. Any defamation of the Queen Contest, its winners and contestants, and the Fair or the PA Fair Queen Program and their Directors and Committee members, whether it be oral or written. This includes postings on the Internet.
6. Any uncooperative or unsportsmanlike conduct before, during or after the competition.
7. Appearing in crown and banner at any event without an official invitation from an authorized event coordinator or event board member.

## FAIR QUEEN DRESS CODE:

Wearing of the Fair Queen crown and/or sash is to be considered an honor and privilege. The bearer is now an ambassador representing herself, her family, her community and Fair. Put the effort into making a good impression!

*While fashion styles may change, good taste does not!*

**Therefore responsible, appropriate, and professional appearance is expected** while the Queen is wearing her crown and sash. Attire should be conducive to the specific appearance or event (i.e. banquet, business casual, formal, etc.)

Alterations to the attire rules may be made only if

1. severe weather or unsafe conditions exist and
2. the Fair Queen's official coordinator or Board Member has approved an alteration consistent with the professional appearance expectation.

Failure to consistently comply with the Dress Code (as viewed on public social media posts, publicity photos, etc.) may be used as a deciding factor by the Judge panel during the PA State Fair Queen Program competition.

### GENERAL APPEARANCE ATTIRE RULES

1. No Jeans
2. No outfit that shows cleavage.
3. Dresses/skirts must be no shorter than the height of a dollar bill (approx 2.5") from the bottom of the dress/skirt hem to the top of the knee cap.
4. No clothing that advertises, promotes, or glorifies the use of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or anything inconsistent with the dignity of the Queen Program.
5. No visible piercings (other than earrings); no visible tattoos

### FOOTWEAR RULES

1. No Sneakers
2. No Flip Flops
3. No Boots – rule applies to
  - a) NO cowboy/western style boots
  - b) NO thigh-high or over-the-knee boots,
  - c) NO muck boots,
  - d) NO work boots "Shoe Boots", with or without a heel, are permitted if the shoe boots are no higher than ankle height (see Figure 1)

### LIVESTOCK BARN & SHOW RING ATTIRE

1. If the fair queen is a visitor in the livestock barns or show rings:
  - a. follow the General Appearance Attire and Footwear Rules (slacks, dresses, skirts)
  - b. Crown and Banner
  - c. Closed-toe shoes for safety reasons.
2. If the fair queen is in the show barns and/or ring as an exhibitor:
  - a. Khaki or similar boot-cut style pants and a presentable shirt (no jeans) (See Figure 2)
  - b. NO Crown. NO Banner
  - c. Closed-toe shoes for safety reasons.
  - d. If the fair queen is also presenting ribbons or awards during her time as an exhibitor, then she may only wear her crown and banner for presentation segment; but not while showing livestock.
3. Boots may be permitted in livestock barns and/or show ring if worn with pants (see 2.a. above) and the pant legs are worn out over the boots (see Figure 3)
